The plans this year include a supper for all members of the local farm bureau, 4-H members and their parents. Following the supper which is to be served at 6.30 there will be a short period for looking at the exhibit of work accomplished during the past year by the local groups. State and county leaders are also bringing some exhibits.

Apple Pie Contest.

An apple pie contest with out of town judges is to be held by the Farm bureau women. The winner of the local contest will exhibit at the state apple pie contest and the winner of the state contest will compete for honors at the Worcester Apple Festival. This local contest should be of great interest. The pies are to be auctioned off at the close of the evening for the benefit of the Farm Bureau student loan fund. Anyone wanting more information about this part of the Achievement day program can get full particulars at the regular meeting of the Farm bureau to be held at 10.30 Thursday, Sept. 8, at the home of Mrs. James Biggar.

A varied program has been planned for the rest of the evening to be opened by singing of 4-H songs by the clubs. Following this will be short talks by Carl Wiklund on conservation, Henry Currier on Farm bureau insurance, Ernest Bigelow on poultry, C. H. Merriam on dairying, J. E. Landry on fruit and Mrs. Biggar on women's work. Kenneth Gibbs and Miss Hazel Colburn will then present the awards and pins for the 4-H work done in Pelham during the year. Miss Myrtis Beecher of Milford is to show colored slides of prize winning kitchens of the country, women's camp pictures and garden visit scenes. It is expected that Mr. Kendall, director of Extension Service of the state of New Hampshire, will be present to give a few remarks about local and state extension work.
