Harry Atwood Retires As Town Postmaster

PELHAM, N. H., May 29—Harry H. Atwood, postmaster at Pelham for approximately 42 years, reached the retirement age, 70 years, on April 8, and will be automatically retired as postmaster, to take effect May 31.

Miss Marion J. Atwood, his daughter, has been appointed acting postmaster. The duties of the office will be transferred at the close of business, May 31.

Postmaster Atwood succeeded Hon. Frank M. Woodbury June 3, 1905. The Pelham, N. H., post-office was elevated from fourth class to third class on July 1, 1944.

Miss Atwood has served the office as clerk since July 27, 1942.
