

List Three More Dead, Two Missing and Four Wounded

Bethlehem, Newmarket, Chesham Men Give Lives; Pelham Sailor Missing Aboard USS Warrington

The New Hampshire war casualty list of Tuesday contains the names of three more Granite states who have paid the supreme sacrifice. Two more from this state are missing in action and four are wounded in action.

The Union-Leader unofficial list of state war dead in World war 2 now stands at 657. The list:

S/SGT. WILLIAM D. ROY, of Bethlehem, husband of Mrs. William D. Roy of Durham, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Roy of Bethlehem, killed in action in France August 25.

PFC. ARTHUR C. SQUIERS, JR., USMCR, brother of Mrs. Evelyn Jackson of Parkis Falls road, Newmarket, killed in action.

T/SGT. ROBERT V. CURTIS, of Chelsea, died from wounds received in action in France on July 29.

→ DONALD R. BAGLEY, M. M. 2/c, USNR, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald W. Bagley of Pelham, a member of the crew of the destroyer USS War-

ington which was sunk during the hurricane of last week, missing in action.
