Local Soldier in Africa—To Resume Church Services

PELHAM, June 24—Corp. Donald E. Burton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter S. Burton, Mammoth road, North Pelham, enlisted at Manchester, N. H., Sept. 17, 1941, in the U. S. air corps.

After 10 days at Fort Devens he was detailed to Jefferson barracks, Mo., for eight weeks basic training

and then to Keesler Field, Miss., where he trained for six months' with the 307th school squadron, graduating March 21 this year from the air corps technical school. He was then assigned to Elgin Field, Fla., and made Private First Class, April 11th and commissioned corporal June 1.

Corp. Burton always a baseball enthusiast, at present catches for the Fixed Gunnery school team which leads the league in that section. He also catches for the Elgin Field team.
