

Four Generations Under One Roof—The Currier Family



The Currier family is one of the oldest and largest in southern New Hampshire. For 150 years they have been residents of Pelham, and various members of the family have been sent to the State legislature and occupied most of the public offices in the gift of their community. The remarkable photograph printed above shows four generations of the Currier family, all living today under one roof. The old Currier mansion at Pelham is in reality three houses, but has been built as one—a main house and two ells—in the traditional New England style. In the picture are shown (reading from left to right):

Top row—Mrs. and Mr. George A. Currier (grandparents) and Mrs. Gertrude Hillman (great-grandmother), 84.

Second row—Mrs. Lillian Marsh Wood Currier, Henry M. Currier, Mrs. H. M. Currier.

Third row—Richard H. Currier, Mrs. R. H. Currier, George Frank Currier (uncle).

Lowest row—Herbert S. Currier, Gertrude Currier and Edward Currier.
