Complete Report on Town Election, Meeting

PELHAM, N. H., March 15 — The annual town meeting and election of officers was held at the town hall Tuesday, with 782 voters going to the polls to cast their ballots. This is 81 per cent of the 963 registered voters.

The polls were opened at 10 o'clock by Moderator Frederick A. Houle and remained open throughout the day until 8 p. m. The selectmen, Andrew L. Mailloux and Albert R. Harris, were on hand acting as election officers. The supervisors of the check list, Ralph S. Boutwell, Saimi Herkomer and Richard C. Mansfield, were present in case of any questions about the check list. Ballot clerks were Donald E. Burton, Thelma C. Boutwell, Kathleen R. Greenwood and Frank W. Atwood.

Corrections for names in yesterday's editions are: For selectman for three years, Andrew L. Mailloux (310) defeated Gerard A. Thellen (283) and Franklin A. Garland (171). Frank W. Atwood (380) defeated Gottfried J. Herkomer (282) and Edith M. Hardy (86) for the unexpired one-year term for selectman.

Norman Provencal (407) defeated Frederick J. Gariepy (296) and William A. Doherty (69) for highway agent.

Alvina Spaulding (658) was elected as library trustee for two years, and Alva M. Taylor (619) for three years.

Town Meeting

At 1:45, the moderator opened the meeting to act on the articles of the warrant. Article 3—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same. The budget, as recommended by the budget committee, was taken up item by item and all recommendations were accepted.

General government: Town officers' salaries, \$1700; town officers' expenses, \$3000; election and registration expenses, \$650; municipal court expenses, \$150; expenses town hall and other town buildings, \$1000.
