Mrs. Lillian Fish Receives Law Degree from Los Angeles University.

Mrs. Lillian (Mann) Fish, daughter of Mrs. Ella A. Mann of this town, was graduated (magna cum laude) last June from Southwestern University School of Law, Los Angeles, Calif. Mrs. Fish was one of 94 graduates to receive a bachelor of laws degree, and ranked second highest in her class.

She was graduated from Nashua, N. H., high school in 1917, with highest rank, and was taken into the law office of Thomas D. Luce, then clerk of the Superior court, as stenographer and clerk. Fish, chief signalman in the United States navy, he was transferred to San Pedro, port of Los Angeles, Calif., where Mr. Fish had been assigned at the time of the American Legion convention in that city.

Mrs. Fish accepted a position as private secretary with Attorney Lloyd S. Nix of Los Angeles, city prosecutor and a prominent Legionnaire, for work during the convention, after which she became attached to the law office of Nix Bros. and still maintains her position with them.

Miss Bernice H. Lester of Ipswich has been elected to fill the vacancy in the Pelham junior high school. She is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, class of 1931, and did her practice teaching in Nashua junior high school.

Last year Miss Lester did substitute teaching in the Merrimack high school, and also secretarial work in the office of education, at the University of New Hampshire. She attended the university summer school, where she is working for her master's degree.
