PELHAM, N. H., Nov. 22—Mrs. Edith M. Hardy of Pelham Center has received a telegram from the war department, informing her that her son, Sergt. Roy E. Hardy, was injured in action in Leyte, Oct. 20.

Mrs. Hardy has received two letters from her son, written early this month, but no mention was made of his being injured. However, he did express thankfulness that he was able to write home, which perhaps was as far as censorship would allow.

Writes from Germany

The much delayed letters of Pvt. Roderick Ducharme relate interesting experiences: beginning with the rough trip across the English Channel from England, and landing at the Omaha beachhead. He tells briefly of the many places he has passed through in France, Belgium and Holland on his way to Germany. On the way, his 30th division experienced very little fighting. In fact, he says there were many interesting incidents to be thankful for—pleasant assignments and cordial relations—although necessarily they were of short duration.

His division had an active part in the capture of Aachen, Germany, where fighting was extremely fierce.
