Funeral services for Russell Hayes of Pelham Centre were held Tuesday afternoon at 2.30 o'clock at the Pelham Congregational church. Rev. Ralph Hoffman, pastor, officiated. Mrs. Rena S. Currier was at the church organ. A large number of friends attended and the floral pieces were abundant and beautiful. Burial was in the family lot in Gibson addition cemetery. The bearers were Warren Kennedy, Harold Mooney, Edmund Landry, Sidney Vining, Frank Carleton, Elmer Raymond jr., Roderick Ducharme and Frank Atwood.

Sorrow over the untimely death by accident of Mr. Hayes and deep sympathy for the family and relatives and those involved in the accident is expressed in general throughout this community. The deceased enjoyed a large circle of intimate friends, who deeply mourn his passing.

He was born in Mapleville, R. I., Sept. 7, 1922, and came here about 8 years ago. He leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank C. Hayes; two brothers, Edward F. of Chelmsford and Clifton of Pelham and one sister, Mrs. Alfred Jacobson also of Pelham. He was a member of the Pelham Fire department and of Pelham Grange.
