Sergt. Jewett Takes Miss Koehler as Bride

PELHAM, June 28—Miss Ethel A. Koehler and Staff Sergeant Elwin S. Jewett, both of this town, were married at Pelham Congregational church last Saturday evening at 7.30 o'clock. More than 150 relatives and friends witnessed the ceremony which was performed by Capt. Clifford W. Laws, regimental chaplain in the 37th A. R. 4th Armored Division, a friend of the family.

The couple stood before an arch banked with greenery and flowers and the double ring service was used. The bride was given in marriage by her father, William S. Koehler. Her gown was of white satin. She wore a shoulder length veil and carried an old fashioned bouquet—white sweet peas, roses and baby breath. Her sister, Miss Doris L. Koehler was her bridesmaid. She wore a gown of embroidered pink organdy, with blue accessories and a pink shoulder length veil and carried an old fashioned bouquet of mixed flowers with blue predominating.

The bridegroom was attended by his brother, Richard Jewett as best man, who enters active service in the U. S. Army July 1. Miss Bernice Moulton officiated at the organ, and Mrs. Shirley Davies Parker sang the selections before the ceremony.

Mrs. Jewett received her early education in the public schools of her native town, later graduating from Lowell high school. She then attended a four-year course at the University of New Hampshire, Durham, majoring in hospital dietetics and graduating with honor in the class of '43. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William S. Koehler of Bridge street.

Staff Sergeant Jewett a resident of Pelham for the past four years, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George Jewett of Hyde Park, Mass. He entered the service in January 1942 and was assigned in the Q.
