TOTALS \$14,000

117 Towns Contribute, While
111 Do Nothing—Quota
Was \$22,000

CONCORD, Oct. 31.—A report has been made by Arthur Chase, State Director of the War Service Library Fund committee. An analysis of the result is interesting. One hundred and seventeen towns contributed while one hundred and eleven towns did nothing. Of those which contributed 47 over-subscribed their quota and 29 reached their quota, while only 41 were under their allotment.

The total amount contributed by the 117 towns was within \$1,000 of the total quota of those towns, showing that if the towns that did nothing had been equally energetic the quota for the state would have been nearly raised.

The quota to be raised by New Hampshire, five per cent of its population, was about \$22,000. The amount thus far turned in is over \$14,000 and will probably reach \$15,000 when all returns are in.

New Hampshire has reason to congratulate itself upon the tireless and successful work of its library representatives in the towns that contributed.
