

Quilt Given Pelham, N. H.

Family Contained \$50

Occasionally, we hear and read of instances of rugged honesty that stand out so clearly and unquestioned as to thrill us with pride and respect for the ones who unhesitatingly demonstrate that virtue. Such an instance was brought to light recently by Clarence H. Muldoon, of Pelham, N. H., who appreciated very much this experience.

Two years ago this month, fire destroyed the home and all the household belongings of Mr. and Mrs. Eliot G. Pearson in Pelham. Soon after, sympathetic neighbors, contributed from their own surplus of goods, various articles to the need and for the comfort of the Pearson family. Among other things, the Muldoons contributed a bed quilt that had previously been

lodged in their attic for safe keeping.

Last night, "Honey," the little daughter of Mrs. Rowell Pearson was scratched by an open safety pin as she cuddled herself in bed, which was found to have fastened a small bag containing five crisp new \$10 bills within the folds of the comforter.

At 10 o'clock last Thursday night Mr. and Mrs. Pearson called at the Muldoon residence to verify their own identification of the quilt and incidently to return the \$50 which they insisted must have been sewed within by some member of the Muldoon family, previous to their donating the bed quilt.
