He had but recently enjoyed his 16th birthday anniversary. He died last Thursday at Hillsboro County hospital, where he had been removed for an operation last Sunday in a very serious condition. Among his schoolmates the boy was one of the most popular students at Pelham high school and an acknowledged leader in his studies beloved by his teachers' always taking a prominent part in school activities.

Rev. Fr. Finn of Methuen officiated at the services. Music was by Miss Ryan, soloist and Miss Morse, organist. Burial was in Gibson addition of Pelham Centre cemetery. Six of his young friends acted as bearers.
