### Mrs. Alice M. Overlock Receives Letter of Appreciation from Mayor Thompson.

Mrs. Alice M. Overlock of this town is in receipt of a letter of appreciation from Mayor Perry D. Thompson of Lowell for valuable service rendered the city during the influenza epidemic. Mrs. Overlock served as a Red Cross district nurse for three weeks and as a volunteer nurse at the contagious hospital for two weeks. Experience, gained previously by study and application, combined with a natural sympathetic and cheerful disposition, fitted her exceptionally well for the work and many personal testimonials have been given of her conscientious devotion to duty and her success among the afflicted whom she attended. Great credit is due her as an efficient member of the Red Cross unit and her devotion and success as a volunteer in the work is highly commendable. Her efforts are viewed with pride and admiration by her townspeople.

Charles S. Piper, a former resident of this town, died at the residence of his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence M. Wyman, here today, aged 46 years. As motorman previously employed locally by the Massachusetts Northeastern Street Railway Co., for about 14 years, he acquired a large circle of friends who will deeply regret the news of his death. Two years ago he moved to Dixville Notch, N. H., where he had charge of "The Balsams" fish hatchery and later he went to Rhode Island in the same line of occupation. A few weeks ago he returned to Pelham in declining health and had rapidly failed until his death today. He leaves his wife, Mrs. Florence Piper, a native of this town.
