

Tyngsboro Man Accused as Camp Looter

Victor G. Magoon
and Four Boys
Haled Before Court

NASHUA, N. H., Feb. 26—Victor George Magoon, 42, of Tyngsboro, and four Hudson, N. H., youths ranging from 14 to 17, were accused today of having robbed several Gumpas pond summer homes of many hundreds of dollars worth of articles, including heavy furniture and mechanical equipment.

Magoon was arraigned today in Nashua municipal court and held in \$2000 bail for the April sitting of the Rockingham county grand jury, on charges of breaking and entering and larceny. The boys will be summoned before juvenile authorities.

Police Chief Arthur W. Peabody of Pelham and Sheriff Richard M. O'Dowd were in court to appear against Magoon.

Last week, Magoon was arrested in Lowell by police of that city on a charge of receiving stolen property, after investigation had shown the articles had been taken to a Dutton street secondhand store for sale on consignment.

Magoon was one of the several men involved in the \$100,000 Lowell postoffice larceny case 10 years ago.
