A careful comparison and checking up indicates that the Pelham men fairly certain to be called for examination by the exemption board at Milford, N. H., will be as follows: James Doherty, 27th in district; Longin Rostoukas, 44th; George W. Rettaker, 62nd; Hugh V. Tallant, 78th.

Hillsboro county, outside of Manchester, must raise 598 men for the new army and as 467 have already enrolled 131 are to be secured by draft. The Nashua district must furnish 79 men and the Second district, which includes all the towns in the county outside of Manchester and Nashua, must furnish 52 men. If but twice the number of men to be drafted are notified to appear for examination it would mean only those men as named would be called. If more men are needed, the men are called in the order drawn at Washington and the next four Pelham men stand as follows in the district's list: Albert A. Tallant, 190th; Elmer L. Coombs, 205th; Nelson W. Barter, 259th; Walter S. Burton, 282nd.
