

# Pelham Man Honored at Yale University

## Donald Young Named To Scholars Of The House Program

**NEW HAVEN, Conn., Aug. 1—**Donald Adam Young, a member of the Yale class of 1954, of Pelham, N. H., is one of nine outstanding students named to the university's Scholars of the House program for the academic year 1953-54. He is the only member of the entering junior class admitted to the program.

Under this program, established in 1947, the students are relieved of all formal class requirements so that they can pursue a course of independent work. However, they may attend any classes which will help them in their project.

The Scholars of the House program was organized to allow a small number of unusually qualified students as much academic freedom as possible to enable them to concentrate on their own projects. By May of his senior year, each scholar must present a finished essay or project that justifies by its scope and quality the freedom he was allowed. Students must have an average of 85 for three years to qualify for admission to the program. In exceptional cases, however, students like Young are admitted on the basis of two years of work.

Young is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Adam A. Young, of Windham road. He is manager of the Suit Pressing agency at Yale. He attended Nashua high school in Nashua, N. H.
