WOBURN, MASSACHUSETTS
PELHAM, NEW HAMPSHIRE*

DAVID HAMBLET & JOHN HAMBLETT OF PELHAM NH

We know that Barker and Henry Baldwin, both of Woburn MA, built a cabin together and settled in Pelham in 1726-27, that was Dunstable MA at the time. Their cabin was located on Baldwin's Hill in close proximity to John Butler and the Gage brothers. And we know that Henry Baldwin, son of Henry, married Abigail Butler, daughter of John. It was Baldwin/Barker, and Hamblet / Butler (1721) who shared cabins. Dunstable became Nottingham MA and then Nottingham West & Pelham NH in the acreage accorded to Pelham in the boundary changes.

It has been written that John Butler and David Hamblet purchased the plot of land of land in Pelham, cleared the land and built a cabin to bring their families to, from Woburn MA. I have found no further evidence of David Hamblet in Pelham, so I assume that Joseph and John Hamblett are his sons. John would have been 11-12 years old when the family moved to Pelham. There are no other Hamblet/Hamblett's in this time frame in Pelham.

On 29 October 1735 John Hamblett b. 1708-09, of Nottingham MA, m. 29 Oct 1735 Phebe Baldwin (Daniel 2 Henry 1) at Woburn MA b. 28 December 1708. They resided in Nottingham MA that became Nottingham West and then Pelham NH. Phebe Baldwin is cousin to Henry Baldwin 3, and sister of John Baldwin 3 of Pelham, and whether the name of Hamblet is spelled with one T or two, either is correct.
