1. GEORGE MARSH

And his wife Elizabeth, with their four children, in company with twenty other families, including their pastor Rev. Peter Hobart and family, most of whom were from Hingham, Norfolk Co., England, left their homes in the Spring of 1635 to make for themselves a home in this New World, where they could enjoy freedom to worship God according to their own conscience more fully than they were allowed to do in England, and landed at Charlestown June 8th. But Rev. Peter Hobart says in his journal that they arrived in the harbor on the 4th.

From Charlestown they proceeded to Hingham, about fourteen miles southeast of Boston, so named from the town from which most of them came.

On the 18th of September following they cast lots for house lots and the following is the record of

GEORGE MARSH'S DEED.

"Given unto George Marsh, for a houselot, five acres of land, bounded with the land of Richard Osborn eastward, and with the highway leading to Squirrell Hill westward, butting upon the Common northward, and upon the Town Street southward."

The following year, March 3, 1636, he was made freeman. On the 2d of July, 1647, he died leaving a wife and four children, as appears from his will made the same day.

Married Sarah, daughter of John and Nazareth (Hobart) Beal, March 22, 1649. She was b. in England 1624, and d. Nov. 9, 1710. He was made freeman May 15, 1654, and d. Sept. 2, 1658, leaving the following

WILL:

"Aug. 31, 1658. I, Thomas Marsh, of Hingham, being sick, do make this, my last will.

I give all my estate, land and cattle whatsoever, unto Sarah my wife, and unto my four children Thomas, Sarah, Ephraim and Mary. My intent is that my wife, whom I ordain executrix of this my last will, shall carefully educate and bring up my children with what estate I leave her.

And my will is, that whenever my youngest daughter Mary, shall attain to the age of 14, and my sonne Thomas 21 years, then, whatever remains of the estate be divided among them; the one half of that estate that is left to Sarah, my wife, the other half to my four children, as followeth: My eldest sonne Thomas, two shares, and my other three children single shares. And I appoint as overseer of this my will, my friend Mathew Hawkes, John Fearing, Nathaniel Beal and Sarah my wife."

3. ONESIPHORUS OF GEORGE

Married Hannah, daughter of John and Mary Cutler of Hingham, Feb. 6, 1655. He resided in Hingham awhile, taking the freeman's oath in 1672, but removed to Haverhill about 1674, where, having purchased a lot of land, he built a house which his descendants have continued to occupy until the present time.

There was also a garrison built upon his farm which he and his son Onesiphorus, with five others, guarded during the Indian troubles of 1690.

In 1687, when the notorious Andrew, whom the despotic king of Great Britain, James II, had sent over as Governor, ordered an oppressive tax to be levied on the inhabitants, a few other towns showing their hands openly against the assessment, Onesiphorus having been appointed constable declined to use his official authority to sanction the tax, and Andrew, in resentment of his course, fined him £5 6s.

Hannah, his wife, d. March 17, 1686, and he was again married Oct. 29, 1686, to Elizabeth, widow of Samuel Worcester of Bradford, who was son of Rev. Samuel Worcester of Salisbury. She d. May 9, 1690, and the following year, May 18, 1691, he was married to widow Sarah Wallingford of Bradford. He d. in Bradford May 15, 1713, aged 83, and on his tombstone was engraved the following

Married, Dec. 8, 1718, Sarah Severance of Kingston, N. H. She was b. 1698, baptized July 31, 1720. They must have lived awhile in Haverhill, as he and seventy-five others were set off in 1735 to form a church in the West Parish, where he was chosen deacon Jan. 5, 1727, but he removed shortly after to Londonderry, N. H., and previous to 1742 he moved to Nottingham, N. H., the name being changed in 1746 to Nottingham West, and in 1830 to Hudson, his son Thomas having preceded him to this place. He became a prominent man in the town, being Selectman for several years and Representative to the General Court. He d. Nov. 20, 1777, and his widow Sarah d. Jan. 28, 1786.

By his will he made the following provisions for his wife: She was to "receive yearly twelve bushels of Indian corn, four bushels of rye, two bushels of wheat, two barrels of cider, the use of two cows, house to live in, two pounds of flax, ten pounds of sheep's wool, firewood all prepared for the fireplace sufficient for one fire, all my household stuff for her disposal, six dollars a year to be paid her, a suit of proper mourning apparel at my death, my great Bible, four score of beef, eight score of pork, and a sufficiency of salt."

To his son Thomas he gave twelve acres of land. To his daughter Lydia Haseltine ten dollars in addition to what he had already given her. To his son John sixteen dollars. To Samuel all his real estate save the twelve acres he had given his son Thomas.

Married Mary, daughter of Capt. Cutting and Judith (Little) Moody of West Newbury, Aug. 24, 1722. She was b. Aug. 13, 1703.

Capt. Cutting was son of Samuel and grandson of William Moody who came from Ipswich, England, in 1633. Mary was brought to this country by her grand-parents when she was but ten months old.

22. THOMAS OF JOHN OF JOHN OF ONESIPHORUS OF GEORGE

Married, Nov. 17, 1741-44, Ann, daughter of Benjamin and Ruth (Whittier) Greeley of Haverhill. She was b. Feb. 15, 1723-4. Being a shoemaker by trade and going from house to house as the custom then was, he wandered as far as Nottingham West, now called Hudson, N. H., and liked the place so well that he concluded to settle there. Afterwards his father and two brothers, John and Samuel, purchased farms near his.

He was appointed elder in the Presbyterian church previous to 1775, and was a strict observer of the Sabbath, and a prominent man in the town as well as the church. The farm he purchased is still in the possession of his descendants, the daughters of his grandson Hiram. There were no railroads in those days, and "many a time," he writes, "have I taken a load of poultry and other farm products, and starting in company with others for Boston, the only large market, at sunset and driving all night and selling our loads in the morning, we returned the next day without unharnessing our horses."

His wife Ann d. April 19, 1770, and he married Mehitabel Barker of Pelham, N. H., March 1774, having been published on the 7th. She d. Dec. 20, 1805. He d. July 3, 1808.
