CUTTER, SETHCont., Mass. &
N. H. Service.

August 28, 1832, Seth Cutter of Pelham, N. H., aged 74 years, deposed:

that in April or May, 1775, he enlisted at Nottingham West (now Hudson) as a fifer in a company of militia under Capt. Elisha Woodbury, Lieut. Thomas Hardy of Pelham; marched to the vicinity of Boston, Mass. and served as fifer and private for eight months, the time for which he was enlisted;

that, immediately after the expiration of his term, he enlisted at Beverly, Mass., under Capt. William G. Speakman, Col. (later General) Glover, Massachusetts Line; was stationed in New York City several weeks, afterwards at different places on the Hudson, then in Pennsylvania; was in the Battle of Trenton, December 25, 1776, and was discharged December 31, 1776, his term of one year having expired; but, at the earnest solicitation of Gen. Washington, he and others enlisted immediately for six weeks longer; marched to Princeton, N. J., took part in that battle, then to Morristown and Chatham, N. J. From the last named place he was sent out several times in scouting parties and had several skirmishes with the enemy; served out his term and was discharged the middle of February, 1777.

that in April or May, 1777, he enlisted for two months, as substitute for Richard Cutter and served in Rhode Island as orderly sergeant under Capt. Stephen Dana for two months and seven days;

that in July, 1777, he enlisted as substitute for Samuel Smith of Nottingham West, where he then resided, under Capt. James Ford; marched to Vermont; was in the Battle of Bennington and then marched to Stillwater, where he was discharged;

that he was born in Cambridge, Mass., April 14, 1758, and has resided in Pelham, N. H., since the close of the Revolutionary War.

Rev. John H. Church, D. D., and Samuel M. Richardson, both of Pelham, N. H., certified to their belief in soldier's statement.

July 2, 1832, Enoch Howard of Pelham, N. H., testified to service in 1775 with soldier; that they were stationed at Medford, Mass., until after the Battle of Bunker Hill; that, although in different divisions, he and soldier served together in 1776 and both were in Battle of Trenton, &c.

July 6, 1832, BENJAMIN BARKER of Pelham, N. H., testified to service under Capt. Jesse Wilson in 1777, when soldier served under Capt. James Ford; that both were at Bennington Battle and both were discharged at Bemis Heights.

August 17, 1832, PETER JOHNSON of Andover, Mass., aged 82 years, testified to service in 1776 for one year with soldier in same regiment, but different companies.

Certificate from Massachusetts shows one Seth Cutter served under Capt. Stephen Danna at Rhode Island as sergeant for two months and seven days from May 9, 1777.

Claim allowed and Certificate 10327, N. H. Agency, was issued April 3, 1833, for service as private and sergeant under Act June 7, 1832.

Fought under Col. (later General) Stark at Bunker Hill. Slightly wounded at Bunker Hill. Farm on east side of Mammoth Road between Burns and Tenney Roads. Owned by Robert Hirsch 2010.
