

GAGE, DANIEL.

New Hampshire Service.

May 11, 1818, Daniel Gage of Bethel, District of Maine, 56 years of age, deposed:

that he enlisted at Danbury, Connecticut in December 1778 under Capt. Jason Waite, Col. Joseph Cilley, 1st New Hampshire Regiment, served as Sergeant in the same Company (although it was afterwards commanded by Capt. Moody Dustin until June 5, 1783 when he received a discharge, signed by George Washington and left the service;

was at the taking of Cornwallis and has lost his discharge.

AMOS GAGE of Bethel, Maine testified to seeing soldier in service a number of times during the term of service etc.

Amos Gage.

A Warrant signed by "Geo. Reid Lt. Colo. Comdt." and dated June 5, 1783, appointing Daniel Gage "to be the Third Serjeant in the 5th company whereof Moody Dustin is Capt." was filed with the application;

also the testimony of Jonathan Abbot and Samuel Chapman, Selectmen of Bethel, District of Maine, as to the need of soldier for a pension.

Claim allowed.

age, testified that he owned "84 acres of poor, rocky land and a small old house and barn;" that since 1818 his right hand and arm have become useless and he is unable to hold a pen; that he has in his family a wife Dolly, 56 and Abigail Russel, 34.

Name dropped from the rolls on account of property.

February 28, 1824 Daniel Gage of Bethel, Maine 62 years of age, applied again and at that time had only a wife, Dolly, 60 years of age, in his family; he had been compelled to sell his farm the year before to Dr. John Grover to pay his debts to Grover, Isaac Adams of Gilead, Maine and Abigail R. Twitchell, Washington Bragg, Timothy Carter, Eli Twitchell Jr., Timothy Chapman, all of Bethel, Maine as well as to Dorothy Gage, wife of Daniel Gage who testified Dec. 23, 1824 that in October 1811 while the widow of Ingalls Bragg, deceased (who left two heirs and some estate) she married Daniel Gage; that before her marriage she lent Gage \$150.00 on condition that he would pay the same, with interest to the heirs of said Bragg when they became 21 years of age; that Dr. Grover agreed when he bought the land of Gage to pay that amount, the heirs having not yet reached the desired age etc.

Name restored to the rolls March 30, 1825.

August 28, 1832 and May 24, 1833 Daniel Gage, 70 in 1832, applied for a pension as Sergeant which was allowed and Certificate 18307, Maine Agency, was issued August 8, 1833, Act of June 7, 1832.
