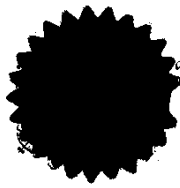


Annual Meeting Warrant  
March 10, 1885.

# State of New Hampshire.



To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham qualified

to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified To meet at the Town House  
in said Town, on the tenth day of March next, at One of the  
clock in the after noon, to act on the following subjects:

1st— To Choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting.

2 — To Choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

- 3<sup>d</sup> To see how much money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the year ensuing
- 4<sup>th</sup> To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Highways for the year ensuing.
- 5<sup>th</sup> To see how much of the Highway tax the Town will vote to pay in money the year ensuing.
- 6<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Resident Highway tax all paid in money and be paid out to the Surveyors of the several Districts where such tax was raised to be worked by them the same as other Highway tax
- 7<sup>th</sup> To see how much of the Literary Fund the Town will vote to expend for schooling for the year ensuing
- 8<sup>th</sup> To see what disposition the Town will make of the Dog Fund for the year ensuing
- 9<sup>th</sup> To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for school purposes for the year ensuing
- 10<sup>th</sup> To see what distribution the Town will make with the school money for the year ensuing
- 11<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will vote to buy another Road Machine. And if voted in the affirmative to raise money and choose a Committee to carry the same into effect
- 12<sup>th</sup> To see how much, if any, of the Town debt, the Town will vote to pay the year ensuing
- 13<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will vote to make all necessary repairs on, and furnish suitable dishes for, their Town House. And if voted in the affirmative to raise money and choose a Committee to carry the same into effect
- 14<sup>th</sup> To see what action the Town will take in relation to the Will of the late Mrs John C Tenny, whereby the sum of one hundred <sup>dollars</sup> is bequeathed to the Town of Pelham for the purpose of keeping in suitable repair the Correll lot in the Cemetery of said Town.
