To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham qualified
to vote in Town affairs :

Pursuant to an application to us of this date by ten voters of said Town, You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town on the Ninth of May next, at Two of the clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects;

Art. 1. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road running across the Town Common in a South Easterly direction by the East end of the Town House starting from the North Pelham road and ending at the Lowell road, also the road running across the Town Common in a South Westerly direction starting at the Lowell road and ending at the road leading past Mrs. James Taylor.

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to erect a fence to keep the public travel from crossing the Town Common.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to buy some new furniture for the Town House and make necessary repairs on the said Town House.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to observe "Memorial day"

Art. 5. If any or all of the above named Articles are voted in the affirmative To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate money for the same.

Art. 6. To choose all necessary committees to carry the above articles into effect if voted in the affirmative.
