# Town Warrant

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham in the County of Hillsborough (L. S.) in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Pilgram Hall in said Pelham on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to raise, appropriate and set apart the amount of money necessary to secure State Aid for permanent improvement of highways made under the law passed January session, 1905.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of highways and bridges for the en-

**suing year and make appropriation for the same, and determine in what manner the same shall be expended.**

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extermination of the Gypsy and Brown tail moths, also the Elm Tree Beetles, and take any action relating thereto.

6. To choose two persons for three years for Trustees of Cemeteries.

7. To choose one person for Trustee of Public Library for three years.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law for Public Library.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Cemeteries the ensuing year.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

11. To see if the town will vote to build a Town Hall Building, and if voted in the affirmative, to see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same: and to choose a committee to carry the same into effect or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on tax list of 1915, paid on or before September 1, 1915.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the Town School District of the Town of Pelham, qualified to vote in District affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Pilgrim Hall in said district on Saturday the twentieth day of March, 1915, at half past one o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools.

8. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the tuition of pupils attending High Schools or Academies.

9. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for text-books and supplies for the ensuing year.

10. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the repair of school houses for the ensuing year.

11. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer or Officers and District Clerk and all other District Officers.

12. To see if the District will vote to authorize its School Board to maintain a school, corresponding in grade to the course, or to any part of the course of an approved High School, to secure a location, to raise and appropriate money to carry the same into effect or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to contract with the Nashua High School to furnish instruction to its scholars for the ensuing year.

14. To see if the District will vote to continue the school now established for its seventh and eighth grade pupils, and if voted in the affirmative, to see how much

## STATISTICS

The school year in five of the schools was 34 weeks, in grades 7 and 8, 35 weeks.

School No. 1—First term, 45 scholars: second 38; third 35; year 50. Average attendance, 31.

School No. 2—First term, 23 scholars; second 20; third 22; year 24. Average attendance, 18.

School No. 3—First term, 22 scholars; second 24; third, 29; year, 29. Average attendance, 20.

School No. 4—First term, 32 scholars; second, 25; third, 25; year, 35. Average attendance, 22.

School No. 5—First term, 17 scholars; second, 18; third, 15; year, 18. Average attendance, 14.

Grades 7 and 8—First term, 28 scholars; second, 36; third, 34; year, 49. Average attendance, 30.

The number of different scholars who have attended the schools of the town during the year is 183.

The amount expended for teachers and the miscellaneous expenses for all the schools is \$2,530.47.

This does not include the book account, repair bill, or tuition for scholars in High School or salaries.

The book account is \$157.09.

Expenses per scholar for teaching and miscellaneous expenses is \$13.82+.

Expenses per scholar for book supply is 85 cents+.
