HISTORY OF PELHAM TOWN REPORTS

In the early 1850s the Pelham School Board and the Pelham Board of Selectmen began issuing Annual Reports documenting, in great detail, their activities during the prior year. Each report lists all Town and School Officials and details Town and School expenditures paid during the prior year. Each Report is a virtual Who's Who in Pelham for the year reported.

In 1888 the Town Reports began reporting all births, marriages and deaths. Earlier vital records can be found elsewhere in the Hayes-Genoter Library:

The Hayes-Genoter History and Genealogy Library has completed scanning 115 Towns Reports beginning in 1858 and ending in 2008. The 119 reports contain over 11,500 pages of Pelham specific history.
