



This picture was taken about 1900. The building hadn't changed much when William T. Hayes, co-founder of the Hayes-Genoter Library, attended 1946-1949. Two differences: stove was bigger and closer to the chimney. Two new doors to the left of the chimney made it possible to access the two unheated outhouses without leaving the building.

This school never had running water or even an outside well and hand pump.
