



Every 10 years Selectmen are required to perambulate the bounds of the town. Pictured is Selectman/surveyor C. Winthrop Hobbs ("Wint") inspecting Mitchell's pine tree bound, the southeastern point of New Hampshire. The bound replaces a large pine tree marked surveyor Mitchell at the direction of King George in 1741. The New Hampshire boundary east of this point parallels the Merimack River along a line three miles north of the river. The state line to the west follows a due west course to New York State.
